DAY 1: Arrival to Baltra & Santa Cruz Highlands

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## DAY 2: Dragon Hill & Chinese Hat

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## DAY 3: Genovesa Island

As you ascend the rocky terrain, take in the captivating behaviors of these avian inhabitants. The elevated vantage point affords panoramic views of the island's coastal expanse, enhancing the overall experience. Subsequently, in the afternoon, proceed to the renowned Darwin Bay, an immaculate white-sand beach gracefully enclosed by Genovesa Island's crescent shape. Bearing the name of Charles Darwin, this location pays homage to the island's profound natural beauty and rich biodiversity. A serene stroll along the sandy shores unveils colonies of frigatebirds, swallow-tailed gulls, and red-footed boobies. The option to engage in snorkeling activities in the pristine waters provides an intimate encounter with marine life, from vibrant reef fish to the playful presence of sea lions. The afternoon at Darwin Bay assures an immersive and refined exploration of the Galapagos, seamlessly blending picturesque landscapes with the contemplative observation of the islands' unique wildlife.

## DAY 4: Black Turtle Cove & Las Bachas

Enjoy a leisurely stroll, spot flamingos and crabs, and consider optional snorkeling to explore the vibrant marine life. Bachas Beach provides a tranquil escape for a delightful afternoon in the Galapagos.



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## DAY 5: Tagus Cove & Urbina bay

Embark on a morning exploration of Tagus Cove, a historic anchorage situated on Isabela Island. This site, known for its dramatic landscape and historical inscriptions left by pirates and whalers, offers a captivating blend of natural beauty and human history. As you traverse the trails, witness the striking views of Darwin Volcano and Darwin Lake, surrounded by the arid volcanic terrain.
